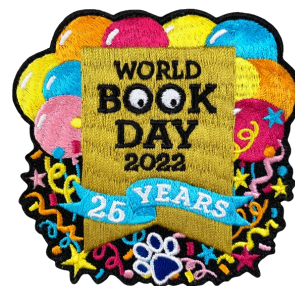

COVID UPDATES From 24th February 2022:

Safe Parking —drop off and pick up times

We have become aware that parking and driving around our school and Petersfield Gardens car park is becoming increasingly hazardous. It is vitally important, for the safety of you and your children, to ensure that you stop and park safely even if it is only for a few minutes to drop them off. Illegal and inconsiderate parking around the school is causing hazards for road users and pedestrians alike and we very are concerned that accidents could occur.

WHERE CAN'T I PARK?

- ◇ On school entrance markings during school hours.
- ◇ On public footpaths and verges.
- ◇ Partially or fully across a dropped kerb for a driveway.
- ◇ Within 10 metres of a junction.
- ◇ Around a bend where oncoming traffic has a restricted view.
- ◇ On school zig-zags and double-yellow lines.



We are well aware vehicular access to the School is far from ideal and that we all face time pressures, especially in the morning, but we would ask you to consider how you would feel if, because of your actions, a child was injured or worse. Equally, it is important that the children are supervised fully on the car park and do not run around or play as a large number of vehicles enter and leave the car park at these busy times of day.
