We hope you have enjoyed seeing our umbrella display outside the front of school this week. The Neurodiversity Umbrella Project has been designed by the ADHD Foundation:

Every Umbrella Project installation helps to raise awareness and understanding of neurodiversity. Thousands of colourful umbrellas are strung together over public spaces, in schools, and in company buildings around the nation. Each display is designed to represent the one in five of us who have a neurodevelopmental condition, such as ADHD, Autism, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia or Tourette's syndrome. These conditions fall under the umbrella term of neurodiversity. We are changing the perception of neurodiverse/neurodivergent people and celebrating all the many strengths that come from thinking differently.

We have been so pleased to hear the conversations about neurodiversity that our umbrellas have already sparked and look forward to continuing to raise awareness and celebrating the neurodiverse members of our school community. Please come and have a look if you haven't had chance yet!
