Attendance

At Twiss Green, we know how important good attendance at school is and how it directly links to children's achievement and attainment. We are pleased that our current whole school attendance is 96.3% and hope to meet our aspirational target of 97% by the end of the school year. We do recognise that when our children are poorly, the very best place for them is at home where they can rest and recover. However, we are also keen to offer any support we can to those children whose attendance is becoming a concern to help make sure they are in school when possible. After half term, families whose children's attendance is below 92% will receive a letter which highlights their child's current attendance and offers to support where we can. Please see attendance information below from our Local Authority Attendance Officer:

90% in a test is good but 90% attendance in your child's life = 1 year missed at school!


10 minutes late every day = 33 hours lost learning each year

1 day absence every week = 2 months lost learning each year

Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to 3 full days of school lost

Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 full weeks of school lost

Arriving 30 minutes late every day adds up to 19 full days of school lost



95% = 10 days = 2 school weeks

90% = 19 days = nearly 4 school weeks

85% = 29 days = nearly 6 school weeks

80% = 38 days = nearly 9 school weeks

75% = 47 days = nearly 10 school weeks

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
NEU Teacher Strikes
