Your centre

Colomendy is perfect for schools and groups looking for an immersive outdoor adventure. This 130 acre site is set in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Deep in the valley surrounded by scenic hills and woodland, brimming with wildlife and with views of Moel Famau.

Loggerheads Country Park is opposite the centre and there are plenty of opportunities to venture off-centre to explore the hills and woodland.

Activities integrated into the stunning woodland, including three huge climbing and abseiling towers, high and low rope activities, a 3G swing, a 200 metre giant zipwire, and an exceptionally realistic caving system built into a natural rock seam.



Peace of mind

Safety comes first at Kingswood; we're founding members of the British Activity Providers Association (BAPA) and affiliated to a whole range of governing bodies. We employ safeguarding leaders and every team member undergoes enhanced DBS checks. There are secure boundaries around our centres and regular night patrols as standard. We're also designated COVID-safe by Kaddi.

Covid policy

The key steps we are taking to ensure everybody who visits are safe include:

- Respecting existing group bubbles
- All team members are tested for covid twice weekly
- Ensuring social distancing is adhered to, with reminders throughout our centres
- Deep cleaning cycles and sanitiser stations. All equipment will be regularly sanitised according to the government's regulations
- PPE will be worn by our team when carrying out safety checks. We will always respect your wishes if you would like to wear your own face covering



Twiss Green Code of Conduct for Residential Visits

If a residential visit is to be successful and enjoyable for all taking part, it is important that everyone involved in the visit behaves in an appropriate manner. Inappropriate behaviour can adversely affect the visit and, in very rare cases, put the safety of others in danger.

In order to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all children on the visit, it is important that all children are aware of, and follow our code of conduct.



Twiss Green Code of Conduct for Residential Visits

All children and parents will be required to sign a Twiss Green Code of Conduct before our residential trip.

On the Coach

- Listen carefully to safety instructions given at the beginning of the journey
- Wear your seatbelt at all times on the coach
- No eating or drinking while on the coach
- Talking quietly on the coach so as not to distract the coach driver
- Listen to any instructions given by the driver or other adults on the coach and follow them without argument
- Be polite and well-mannered
- Be responsible for taking your belongings off the coach at the end of the journey



At Kingswood Colomendy:

- Being polite and well-mannered to other people at the centre
- Listening to the health and safety information provided by the centre and following it carefully
- Staying in designated areas
- Only going outside the building when accompanied by a member of the school staff
- Listening to all instructions given by centre staff and school staff carefully and following them without argument.
- Staying in my own dormitory I understand that I am not allowed to go in any other dormitory unless asked by an adult
- No spray cans or aerosols in the centre
- No food is allowed in the dormitories.
- Being quiet after lights out so that other children can sleep
- Listening carefully when rules are explained in the dining hall and following them carefully
- Only moving from area to another within the Kingswood Colomendy Centre when instructed to do so by school or centre staff
- Using equipment and resources as instructed



Twiss Green Code of Conduct for Residential Visits

- Children who do not follow the code will miss out on 'free' time during the visit. If a child continues to break the code of conduct to the extent that it is felt that they adversely affect the visit of others, their parents will be contacted and asked to collect their child and take them home.
- The code is written for the children, and we ask that the child and parents read the code carefully and then both sign and return to school.



Expectations

- Following the TG Code of Conduct for Residential visits they are ambassadors for our school!
- Prepared to work as a team
- Listening skills really important for safety
- Absolutely no aerosols
- No mobile phones, electronic devices, or valuable items this includes hairdryers and straighteners
- Children can bring a book, travel/ card games, and a teddy bear to keep them company at bedtime!



What Do I Need to Bring With Me?

- See kit list
- All clothes to be named and packing to be done by your child (with supervision!)
- Old clothes not their best designer clothing!
- Vests, t-shirts, long-sleeved tops, fleeces etc. so the children can layer their clothes
- Track suits bottoms, cargo pants, leggings etc. for day wear not jeans
- Old trainers (at least two pairs one that can get wet)
- Centre will provide waterproof coats, trousers and specialist equipment
- Sun hat, sunscreen...woolly hat, gloves!



Important Items to Remember

- <u>Medicines</u>: All medicines to be handed in to Miss Roberts— clearly named and labelled with required dosages and accompanying form. Teachers/ Teaching Assistants to keep and administer them.
- Money: Maximum of £10, in a named wallet, purse, etc. Handed to Mrs. Nightingale before departure.
- <u>A Named Reusable Water bottle</u>: This is essential as the Centre no longer provide this.
