Updating contact information

Mrs Henthorn has asked me to remind you to look out for the contact sheets coming home with children today. We ask that parents and carers from all families review the information we hold about each child and confirm that it is still correct and up to date. Please sign and return both the data Collection sheet and the privacy notice to class teachers on Monday morning next week, even if all information is correct.

PE Days

As you know, the children are allowed to come to school in their kit on the days they have PE. Would you please remind the children (especially our older ones) that this is not a dress down day! Yes, they should be wearing trainers, leggings or tracksuit bottoms, but their top halves should be regular uniform (polo shirt and school jumper/ cardigan). We have said that the children should also bring an additional layer (such as a tracksuit top or fleece). They should **not** be wearing these in place of their school uniform but in addition to it.

Red Nose Day

Usually, we would sell merchandise, but that is not possible this year. What we have decided to do is to hold Red Nose and spoon races in each class. On Friday 19^{th} March we would like the children to bring their own red nose and spoon into school. Each class will be involved in heats and there will be a grand final, with a prize for the winner. We would ask for a minimum donation of £1 per entry, if you are able to donate more that would be wonderful. With 200 children currently on role, it would be really satisfying to raise in excess of £200.
